II. EUCHARISTIC CELEBRATION:

At 8:30 am, the **27th General Assembly** commenced with the celebration of the Holy Mass presided by His Excellency Most Rev. Elias Ayuban, Jr., CMF, DD, Bishop of Cubao, together with Most Rev. Honesto Ongtioco, DD, Most Rev. Ruperto Santos, DD, Most Rev. Antonio Tobias, DD, Most Rev. Cosme Damian Almedilla, DD, Most Rev. Rene Mayugba, DD, Most Rev. Jose Colin Bagaforo, Most Rev. Mylo Hubert Vergara, DD, Most Rev. Allan Dialogo, Most Rev. Francisco de Leon, DD, Most Rev. Teodoro Bacani, Jr., DD, Most Rev. Roberto Mallari, DD, Most Rev. Jesse Mercado, DD and Most Rev. Robert Gaa, DD.

In his homily, Bishop Elias thanked the **SOLIDARITAS Credit Cooperative** for the financial donation to the recently held National Convention of Canon Lawyers, hosted by the Diocese of Cubao.

He then underlined the concept of “**money**” as a tool for mission when used properly; indeed, he averred that it can be of service to the work of evangelization. He added that when we minister to the poor we minister to Christ. Furthermore, he noted that the Solidaritas Credit Cooperative as an institution connotes the concepts of unity, mutual support, and co-responsibility.

He cautioned though the priests not to fall in love with money and to use one’s vocation and status to acquire more money. Instead, he encouraged them to continue to love the priestly vocation and to use money to be of service in living the vocation as priests. He concluded by challenging the priests to use money as an instrument to achieve the mission, which is the mission of Christ.

III. CALL TO ORDER:

At 9:41am, the general assembly stood for the **NATIONAL ANTHEM** led by Fr. Steven Zabala, followed by the **OPENING REMARKS** delivered by

IV. DECLARATION OF QUORUM, RECOGNITION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS, OFFICERS, and COMMITTEES:

At 9:50 am, the Chair, Rev. Fr. Anton CT Pascual, requested the assembly to stand for the formal opening of the **27th General Assembly** and the **Election of Board of Directors** of the **SOLIDARITAS CREDIT COOPERATIVE**.

The Chair acknowledged the presence of the priests and bishops. He then called the Board Secretary to ascertain and to declare a quorum. The Board Secretary informed the assembly that from 510 Regular Members in the previous year, as of January 1, 2025, there are now **1,480 enlisted** regular members, the **SCC General Assembly** needs **370 members** present to ensure a quorum. Fortunately, as of 9:40 am, there were **538** registered attendees; hence, a quorum has been duly established for the **SCC 27th General Assembly**.

The Chair then recognized the presence of representatives from the **CDA**. He also noted that year 2025 is the International Year of Cooperatives. As to date, there are 1 billion members of cooperatives in the planet.

V. ANNOUNCEMENT FOR ELECTION GUIDELINES:

Fr. Roy Bellen, Chair of the Election Committee, together with Fr. Moises Ciego, explained the election guidelines, including the use of the email to submit one’s candidacy. Once received, the **ELECOM** will make the proper coordination if one is qualified to run for office.

Fr. Roy Bellen explained the qualifications to run for office as follows:

- The candidate must be a **MIGS Plus** member,
- He has at least PHP 200,000.00 in share capital,
- He has been a member for, at least, five (5) years,
- He has attended the General Assembly for the past three (3) consecutive years, and
- He has been faithfully patronizing the **SCC** by availing its loans and savings services.

Fr. Bellen then presented the candidates for the office of **Board of Directors 2025-2027**, as follows:

1. Rev. Fr. Rolando Agustin
2. Rev. Fr. Antonio Navarrete
3. Rev. Msgr. Roberto Canlas
4. Rev. Fr. Rosello Hernandez

He also explained the process of voting, which will take only one minute. There are five (5) units of laptop computer available at the lobby for the election process. The voter simply needs to put in his voter's number as indicated at the back of his identification card. For this year, the members are encouraged to vote for three Directors, he added.

At 10:11am, Fr. Bellen announced the start of the election process.

VI. READING and APPROVAL of the MINUTES and PRESENTATION OF THE AGENDA:

The Chair then presented the Agenda for the 27th General Assembly and sought the approval of the Assembly as moved by Fr. Bobby and duly seconded by Fr. Santiago, without any objections, as **G.A. Resolution 2025-01**.

Then the Chair, noting that the Assembly has read the Minutes of the 26th General Assembly held on March 11, 2024 at the VIKINGS' Venue Building A, By the Seaside Boulevard, Pasay City, asked for the acceptance and approval of the Minutes and was moved for approval by a number of priest-members and was duly seconded *viva voce* by the assembly as **G.A. Resolution 2025-02** in accordance with Section 8 d), Article III: Administration of the Amended By-Laws of the Solidaritas Credit Cooperative.

A. Report of the Chairman:

The Chair discussed to the Assembly the **BIBLICAL FOUNDATIONS OF FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP**, citing the following salient points:

- Law of **Ownership** – GOD as the Source Deuteronomy. Wealth comes from GOD, he is our sole source of security
- Law of **Tithing** – Honor GOD first, Matthew 6:33 – **UNLAD** – “*Unahin Nating LAGI ang DIYOS!*” He cited Art. 14 of PCP-II and PCM II Art. 59, which both recommended that **tithing** should be developed in the Church.
- The three purposes of Tithing – PAST for Gratitude, PRESENT for We put GOD first, FUTURE for we TRUST GOD who will take care of us.
- Malachi 3:8-10 – God accuses his people who failed to make the offering as required by Him as “*you are robbing me!*”
- Law of **Investing** – we SAVE. Let your money work for you. Purposes of savings – for emergency, investments, and retirement.
- Law of **Accounting** – keep good financial records. Be DILIGENT in your resources. 4 things to know about your money – how much you own? Earn, owe, and where it goes.
- Law of **Budgeting** – plan your spending not emotional spending. 3 things – LIVE on your budget, do not go beyond budget, focus on your needs not wants. Repayment plan (not burdensome). Make a financial WILL.
- Law of **Contentment** – enjoy what you have (see Phils. 4:10). Do not compare yourself with others.

After his inspiring inputs, he then the Chair proceeded to his report:

- The **SCC** is in the **TOP 20** of the 20,000 cooperatives in the Philippines (with only 100 Billionaire Cooperatives existing in the country), with a total assets of PHP3.8 B as to date.
- **SCC** has received annually the **CDA Certificate of Compliance**, declaring that the **SCC** has fully complied with all the requirements and thus, is duly authorized to operate as such.
- The Chair also noted the remaining 344 Associate members that need to undergo the required seminar so as to be duly elevated to **REGULAR** membership.
- He also proudly announced that members will receive a 14.5% ROE, the highest in the history of **SCC**, plus a 27.38% of Patronage Refund.
- As per STEPS, **SCC** acquired a 70% grade, while the passing grade is 81%.
- The Chair also reminded the Assembly that in MARCH 2026, we start implementing the policy that **ONLY MIGS** can attend the General Assembly; that is, those who faithfully patronize the business of the cooperative. He encouraged the members to avail of the loan services.

- He also reported on the PHP 2M donation to the CBCP Pension Plan that aims to assist CBCP in upgrading the monthly pension rate provided to retired to Filipino priests.
- The Chair then proceeded to outlined the current challenges that SCC has to hurdle:

CHALLENGES:

- To increase the Regular Membership nationwide.
- To welcome Religious (Provincial and Treasurer) as Associate members.
- To increase the current PHP 7,000.00 monthly pension provided by the CBCP to PHP 20,000.00 monthly retirement pension.
- To help dioceses without HMO program to provide their priests with a similar hospitalization assistance program.

With that the Chair concluded his annual report. The Emcee then announced the following “early bird registration winners”:

B. Report of the Management – Rev. Fr. Lambert Ramos

At 10:57 am, the **CEO**, Rev. Fr. Lambert Ramos, presented highlights of Management performance in 2024, as follows:

- He cited that last year **SCC** provided members with 13.5% dividend rate and a 25% patronage refund (a remarkable record in itself); nonetheless, this year, **SCC** surpassed these record-breaking figures with another record-breaking achievement of 14.5% dividend rate and 27.38% patronage refund!
- The **CEO** stirred up the Assembly with a battle cry of: **GO NATIONWIDE!**
- He also promised to complete the upgrading program all members into **REGULAR** members.
- He explained his market participation strategy – a segmentation program with corresponding product offering.

- He happily announced that **SCC** has achieved its goal of transforming its prior earnings dynamics of 80% coming from investments and only 20% from loan services; current figures show that 50% of revenues are now generated from both loan services and investments.
- He reported a Net Surplus in the amount of PHP 205.766M with a PAR rate of only at 5%.
- This remarkable revenue performance that surpassed targets while maintaining expenditures demonstrated an aggressive sales marketing team while relying on a lean and mean effective staff producing an outstanding gross margin of 70% - 80%!
- The Share Capital increase in the amount of PHP 352M or a 58% increase;
- While increase in total assets from PHP 3.2B to PHP 3.8B or an 18% increase in assets, resulting to an ROI of 14.5%.

The **CEO**, then proceeded to discuss the OUTLOOKS in 2025:

- Targeting a 40%-45% market share, translated to 2,400 to 2,700 members cooperators;
- Developing new markets and new products by utilizing innovative tools business growth and a business development program, including a strategic tie-up with the DMCI to provide members with special discounts for condominiums and stand-alone housing units.
- Establishing a program of Priests' Care and Continuing Education program by providing scholarships for priests for a curriculum on Church Management Post-Graduate Course.
- Implementing a Digital transformation process for the **SCC**.

After the CEO's Report, the Emcee called upon Rev. Fr. Angelito Santiago to deliver his inspiring testimony on cooperative experience.

C. Report of the Internal Auditor – Fr. Blanquisco:

Rev. Fr. Nick Blanquisco, CPA, serving as **SCC**'s Internal Auditor, attested to the process of assembling the books of accounts and financial figures that have been duly reviewed by certified public accountants (external audit). He cited their work of verifying the capacity to pay of the borrowers, prior to approving any loan applications of members.

He also explained that **SCC** is being monitored by both Internal and External auditors. The External Auditors have issued an **Unqualified opinion** on **SCC**'s financial performance, which certifies that accounts and financials are in accord with the acceptable accounting standards.

Furthermore, he affirmed his presence in all the meetings of the Board of Directors, examining all the loan applications and reviewing the finances of the cooperative every month. Finally, he witnessed how the Board duly deliberated and voted on all the decisions and resolutions it had made.

He then called upon Mr. Nestor Velasco, CPA, the External Auditor, who vouched on the compliance and stupendous growth of the cooperative. He also certified that the **SCC** has achieved an **unqualified opinion audit** for the fiscal year 2024 – the highest grade that can be granted to an audit opinion.

After the Auditors' reports, the Chair called upon the General Assembly to accept the reports as presented.

Thus, the General Assembly, in accord with Section 8 d) of Article III: Administration of the Amended By-Laws of the Solidaritas Credit Cooperative, heard and duly accepted the reports of the **SCC** Officers, as moved for approval by Fr. Bellen and was duly seconded by Msgr. Canlas as **G.A. Resolution 2025-03**.

After the reports, the Chair, in accordance with cooperative norms, sought the ratification of the general assembly on all the Acts of the Board of Directors, Committees, and Officers for the fiscal year 2023 as moved for approval by Fr. Concepcion and duly seconded by Fr. De Jesus as **G.A. Resolution 2025-04**.

VII. OPEN FORUM, RESOLUTIONS and APPROVAL of the 2025 BUDGET:

Thereafter, the Chair opened the floor for any question, clarification, or comment from the assembly.

With no question for discussion in the Open Forum, the Chair sought the approval of the General Assembly on the following proposed G. A. Resolutions:

General Assembly Proposed Resolution #01: Approval of the Audit Statements of Financial Condition for the fiscal year 2024.

After due deliberations, it was moved for approval by Bishop De Leon and was duly seconded by Bishop Bacani as **G.A. Resolution 2025-05**.

General Assembly Proposed Resolution #02: Approval of Net Surplus Distribution for the fiscal year 2024, as follows:

- 14.5% on Dividends on share capital and
- 27.38% on Patronage Rebate on loans.

After due deliberations, it was moved for approval by Fr. Bernardo and was duly seconded by Msgr. Canlas as **G.A. Resolution 2025-06**.

**General Assembly Proposed Resolution #03:
Approval of Proposed Annual Budget 2025** (see page 62).

After due consultations, the proposed **Budget 2025** was moved for approval by Bishop Bacani and was duly seconded by Fr. Santiago as **G.A. Resolution 2025-07**.

**General Assembly Proposed Resolution #04:
Approval of External Auditor 2025.**

The Chair then presented to the Assembly the nominated **External Auditor** for the fiscal year 2025, the VELASCO, PUNZALAN and Company Audit Firm.

After due deliberations, the assembly moved for the approval of the External Auditor for a term of one year as moved by Fr. Navarrete and was duly seconded by Fr. Bellen as **G.A. Resolution 2025-08**.
